ADMINISTRATION

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of January 2016.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

January 4, 2016: Chief Gale attended the Sportsmen For Youth kick off meeting. This program provides a one day free event for kids to experience all areas of the outdoors including hunting, fishing, hiking, mountain climbing, kayaking, and archery.

January 7, 2016: Chief Gale attended a Face The Book meeting to prepare for alcohol awareness month in April.

January 8, 2016: Chief Gale met with the management at the Mona Lake Boat Club to discuss public assembly permits for the summer at that location.

January 13, 2016: Chief Gale attended the C.O.P.S. Board meeting. Area police chiefs meet monthly to discuss concerns in Muskegon County.

January 14, 2016: Chief Gale attended a Traffic Incident Management meeting in which area supervisors are writing a large scale crash policy for highways in Muskegon County.

January 15, 2016: Chief Gale met with Mona Shores Superintendent Greg Helmer for a monthly meeting to discuss school district issues.

January 19, 2016: Chief Gale attended a WEMET meeting at the Ottawa County Sheriff's Office where the area police leaders discussed drug issues in West Michigan.

January 20, 2016: Chief Gale attended a meeting at the Intermediate School District in which an area emergency response plan is being written for all Muskegon County schools.

January 28, 2016: Chief Gale attended the monthly Rotary meeting to listen to a presentation from Prosecutor DJ Hilson.

The month was busy working on annual evaluations and budget submissions.

Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by -18% for the month and up by +9% for the fiscal year compared to last year. Class B type crimes were down by -38% for the month, and down by -5% for the fiscal year total. Total crimes were down by -27% for the month and up by +3% for the fiscal year to date.

PATROL

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Patrol Division responded to a local business located in the 6000 block of Norton Center Drive regarding an embezzlement report. The owner explained that he was contacted by his credit union asking if he had authorized his employee (secretary) to use the company bank account to pay the secretary's personal credit card account. The owner learned the employee had been using the company bank account to pay her personal credit card balance. The owner indicated 14 transactions totaling \$22,137.78. The owner provided the police with another print out which lists all the extra paychecks that the secretary had issued to herself. The list shows the check number, date, amount and

Patrol Division responded to a business located at 4200 Grand Haven Road regarding an embezzlement. Officers made contact with the owner of the company who stated their ex-employee was stealing money from the company. They confronted the employee who stated she was, in fact, stealing and has taken over \$20,000 during the past year. The employee was fired and the company is seeking to press charges. The investigation is still on going.

Patrol Division responded to over 70 accidents that occurred on City roadways and private property. Most accidents were related to weather and icy road conditions. The officers responded to an additional 25 motorist assist of cars that had slid off roads and needed assistance.


Patrol Division responded to seven overdose complaints throughout the city. These calls were overdoses of both legal and illegal narcotics. Both police and medical assistance was needed. There was an average of almost two a week.

Patrol Division responded to 21 retail frauds that occurred at multiple different retail stores. Out of the 21 complaints, 16 of the suspects where either arrested on site or a warrant has been submitted for charges. Out of those 16 arrests, five were for Organized Retail Fraud, which is a felony charge.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of January was 24,684 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

During the month of January 2016, the Department recorded 1827 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 675 calls for service. A total of 617 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Wednesday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 6 parking tickets and 213 traffic citations in January, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 68.2% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

During the month of January, 20 officers, including six command officers, were sent to training.

Two officers were sent to Kalamazoo Community College on how to better communicate and understand non-verbal communication with citizens that are from different cultures and races.

On January 14 and 28, 14 officers and six command officers were sent to Legal Update in Grandville, Michigan. This is a class that is put on by an attorney from the Michigan State Police who goes over new laws that affect the police. This includes search warrants, gun laws and liability.

One command officer attended Muskegon Diversion Program seminar, this program is looking at different options to seek help for mentally ill people instead of incarceration.

One command officer attended a class on Media Relations at Muskegon Community College.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of January the Detective Bureau was assigned five new cases. Three cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a possible child abuse case. With the assistance of Child Protective Services, an investigation was completed and it was determined that no abuse occurred.

The Detective Bureau conducted follow up investigation on a breaking and entering. Forensic evidence was left at the scene and sent to the Michigan State Police lab. A match was found between the evidence and a sample in the State's database. It was determined the suspect had committed a rash of breaking and enterings in Norton Shores, Muskegon Heights and the City of Muskegon all around the time of this incident. Charges have been requested on the suspect.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 28 arrest warrants and two search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

Detective Neher and Detective Pieske attended legal update training.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective for WEMET assisted in a search warrant of a possible marijuana dispensary and approximately six pounds of marijuana was located and \$1,500.00 was seized.

The Detective for WEMET assisted with buy/busts in the Muskegon and Muskegon Heights area which resulted in a subject taken into custody after selling heroin to an undercover officer.

The Detective for WEMET attended legal update training.

The Detective for WEMET assisted in three search warrants which resulted in seizure of 68 grams of cocaine, 5 grams of heroin, 128 grams of meth and 6.5 lbs of marijuana.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective for ICAC attended training in Atlanta, Georgia provided by the National White Collar Crime Center. The training included Secure Techniques for Onsite Preview and Basic Data Recovery and Acquisition.

The Detective for ICAC assisted in a search warrant in Lake Michigan. The subject was identified and confessed to downloading child pornography. Charges have been filed on the subject.

The Detective for ICAC assisted in two other search warrants where numerous electronic devices were seized and evidence of child sexual abuse material was located on all the devices. Three separate people are charged.
