ADMINISTRATION

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of February 2016.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

On February 1, Chief Gale submitted the police budget to Finance.

On February 3, Chief Gale and Lt. Kasher attended the Michigan Associated Chiefs of Police conference.

On February 10, Chief Gale attended the Muskegon Area Chiefs of Police meeting. Muskegon area law enforcement issues are discussed.

On February 15, Chief Gale, Lt. Kasher and Lt. Poel attended City capital budget meetings.

On February 18, Chief Gale attended the FOP #99 meeting in which Officer Jared Passchier was presented with the Officer of the Year award.

On February 22, Chief Gale, and Lt. Kasher attended general fund budget meetings at City Hall.

On February 23, Chief Gale assisted Holland Police on interviews for a police captain position.

On February 25, Chief Gale contacted all home owners on Seminole and Wickham reference the 5K run scheduled for February 29th.

On February 29, Chief Gale and several other officers assisted with the Mona Shores schools on a 5K fund raising event at the high school.

Class A type crimes (more serious) were up by 24% for the month and up by 10% for the fiscal year compared to last year. Class B type crimes were down by 7% for the month, and down by 5% for the fiscal year total. Total crimes were up by 8% for the month and up by 3% for the fiscal year to date.

PATROL

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Patrol Division arrested one subject for outstanding warrants and another for possession of illegal narcotics. The officer was on routine patrol and was checking the dead end of Lakeshore due to the fact that residents have made multiple complaints about drug use, drinking and illegal activity happening there. Because of this the officer was checking the area and found two subjects inside a parked car after the park had closed. The officer made contact with the occupants of the car and found that one had multiple warrants out for his arrest and was also in

possession of illegal narcotics. The subject was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

Patrol Division made a traffic stop in the City of Norton Shores on a vehicle for suspected driving while under the influence of alcohol. The officer continued his investigation and concluded the driver was under the influence of heroin based on the fact that the officer found a needle and suspected heroin in the driver's pant pocket. The driver also admitted that he had injected himself with heroin earlier. The driver was arrested on the charges of driving while under the influence of a narcotic and possession of heroin. The driver was lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

Patrol Division received a complaint about a cell phone that was stolen and the offender wanted to sell it back to the victim. The victim was contacted by the offender using the victim's phone. The victim believes the subjects used the ICE (Emergency Contacts) screen to contact him. The offender stated he was in possession of the phone and wanted the password to get into the phone. The victim told the offender the phone was stolen and refused to give him the password. The offender called the victim and advised him he could buy the phone back for \$200. The victim told the offender he was interested in buying the phone back and made the arrangement to meet at a parking lot in Norton Shores. The Norton Shores officers met with the victim and devised a plan that the victim would meet with the suspects and once the victim got the phone back the officers would surround the suspects and arrest them. The victim made contact with the suspects and agreed to meet at a business parking lot in Norton Shores. The victim drove to the parking lot and made contact with the two suspects. The male suspect handed the victim his cellphone. The suspects were then taken into custody by the police without any problems. The offenders admitted to stealing the victim's cell phone and trying to sell it back to the owner. Both suspects were arrested, charged and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

Patrol Division had multiple overdoses due to heroin over the past year. A parking lot located on E Sherman across from Mercy Hospital is a hot spot for users to inject their heroin while sitting in their car. While on routine patrol, the officers checked the area and located what he thought was a subject sitting in her car and injecting heroin. He approached the car and made contact with the person sitting in the driver's seat. The driver was in fact injecting heroin in her arm and the officer was there in time to stop it. The officer located a syringe full of heroin and additional heroin in the car. The subject was arrested and charged with possession of heroin. Because of this officer's efforts, he was able to stop a potential narcotic overdose or, worse yet, someone driving under the influence of narcotics.


Patrol Division took a complaint reference embezzlement from a business in the city of Norton Shores. The officer investigated the case and found that the suspect who is an employee worked at the business for the past year. The owner of the business discovered that the suspect had taken a check from the store and wrote it out to herself for the amount of \$700.00. This check was cashed at local a bank in the city of Norton Shores. The officer has collected

evidence to support the charge of embezzlement and submitted a warrant request to the Muskegon County Prosecutor for charges of Uttering and Publishing and larceny.


Total cruiser mileage for the month of February was 27,344 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

During the month of February 2016, the Department recorded 1846 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 771 calls for service. A total of 609 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Friday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 2 parking tickets and 270 traffic citations in February, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 63.1% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

In the month of February all officers including command attended over 40 hours of training. The types of training included seminars for command and Use of Force training.

On February 3-5 Chief Gale, Lt Kasher and Lt Poel attended the Michigan Chiefs of Police Conference located in Grand Rapids, MI. Seminars that were attended include: Management of Personnel, laws that involve Freedom of Information Act, CALEA/Departmental Standards, Legalization of Marijuana and How to Handle the Media/Social Media.

On February 24, Lt Kasher attended a West Michigan Consortium Training meeting on future trainings and registering the officers for upcoming classes.

On February 17, 18, 24 and the 25th the Norton Shores Firearms Instructors taught an in house training for the whole department in regards to the Use of Force. This included firearms and taser. The officers were trained for approximately one hour on various scenarios from the MILO Range database. The officers were trained to use loud verbal commands in attempt to deescalate any situation. The officers were also trained to use the level of force necessary to defuse the situation which included less than lethal or deadly force. All officers including the command staff completed this training.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of February the Detective Bureau was assigned six new cases. Three cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated an embezzlement by a long time secretary/payroll employee who embezzled approximately \$600,000. Suspect was arrested and is currently awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated a prescription fraud where a subject wrote four fraudulent prescriptions at a local pharmacy. The offender was interviewed and they confessed to the crime.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 47 arrest warrants and two search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at

the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

All members of the Detective Bureau attended department training involving decision making and use of force.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective for WEMET assisted in a search warrant where 3.5 grams of cocaine was seized, as well as a pistol. The suspect was lodged for possession with the intent to deliver cocaine and felon in possession of a firearm.

The Detective for WEMET assisted in a search warrant of a residence where 12 grams of crack cocaine, 13 grams of heroin/fentanyl and \$800.00 was seized. Resident of the home was lodged on multiple charges.

The Detective for WEMET assisted in a search warrant of a home after a delivery of 100 grams of cocaine arrived. \$4000.00 was also seized from the home.

The Detective for WEMET swore to four search warrants. The Detective assisted in seizing 107 grams of cocaine, 17 grams of heroin, 3 firearms, and \$6300.00.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective for ICAC completed two examinations for the Muskegon County Sheriff's Department that is investigating a Criminal Sexual Assault complaint that involved an adult male having sex with a juvenile female. Evidence of the crime was located on the electronic devices and charges are being pressed on the adult.

The Detective for ICAC completed four cellular phone data acquisitions for NSPD on various cases. Evidence was located on all the devices and assisted in the investigations.
