ADMINISTRATION

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of March 2016.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

March 2, 2016: Chief Gale attended Pizza with the Police at Greek Tony's Pizza.

March 3, 2016: Chief Gale attended a countywide meeting in regards to school emergency response plans.

March 4, 2016: Chief Gale met with Director Michelli of the Fruitport Township Public Safety department regarding police communication and cooperation.

March 8, 2016: Chief Gale attended the Grand Valley State University Police Academy board meeting.

March 9, 2016: Chief Gale attended the Muskegon Area Chiefs of Police meeting.

March 9, 2016: Chief Gale hosted the Norton Shores Police command meeting.

March 14, 2016: Chief Gale and Lt. Poel met with the staff at Mona Shores School reference a criminal justice recruitment day.

March 15, 2016: Chief Gale, Lt. Poel and Officer Trombley met with the area Traffic Incident Management Task Force regarding highway policies.

March 16, 2016: Chief Gale met with Commissioner Bob Scolnik reference a public assembly permit.

March 18, 2016: Chief Gale attended ethics training at Grand Valley State University.

March 19, 2016: Chief Gale hosted a fund raiser for the Hunters Safety Program, so the course can be offered for everyone for free. Over \$4000 was raised for the program.

March 21, 2016: Chief Gale, Lt. Poel, and Lt. Kasher attended budget meeting at City Hall.

March 24, 2016: Chief Gale hosted an annual awards meeting for all police officers and retirees.

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March 30, 2016: Chief Gale and Lt. Poel attended the CALEA conference in St. Louis, Missouri where the CALEA commission voted to extend the police department certification for four more years. Further information will be provided.

Class A type crimes (more serious) were up by 2% for the month and up by 10% for the fiscal year compared to last year. Class B type crimes were up by 11% for the month, and down by 4% for the fiscal year total. Total crimes were up by 5% for the month and up by 3% for the fiscal year to date.

PATROL

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Patrol Division responded to over 38 alarms in different parts of the city. The alarms were from both residential homes and businesses. All of the alarms were found to be false or related to the weather.

Patrol Division responded to a hold up alarm at a local business located at the 700 block of Summit where it was discovered that a male suspect, armed with a hand gun, entered the store and robbed the place. The offender then got into a vehicle and left towards Henry Street. The officers processed the scene which included taking crime

scene photos and obtaining video. No one was hurt during the robbery. The suspect was apprehended on another armed robbery which took place in the City of Muskegon. The suspect is currently lodged in jail on armed robbery charges.

Patrol Division responded to a robbery call at 2900 Getty Street. The officer arrived on scene and saw several dollar bills on the ground in the parking lot. The suspect had a black handgun and pointed it at the employee and motioned him to the cash register and told him to give him all the money. The suspect was apprehended on another armed robbery that took place in the city of Muskegon. The suspect is currently lodged in jail on armed robbery charges. The investigation is still on going.

Patrol Division responded to a residential breaking and entering call in the 2600 block of Valk. The officer spoke with the victim who said he is remodeling his home, which is currently empty. The victim left his tools in the home when he left for the evening. The items stolen include saws, drills, hand tools and some boxes of Tarkett brand laminate flooring. The officers processed the home for possible fingerprints and took photos of the door and window that was possibly used to gain entry. The crime is still being investigated.

Patrol Division responded to a break in of a business which occurred in the 200 block Seminole. The officers arrived to find the front glass door was smashed out. The officer investigated and could see a rock lying on the floor approximately 10-12ft inside the business. The rock was about 5-6 inches in diameter. The door was intact enough that the suspect did not get in. The officers followed the suspect's foot tracks through the snow for approximately a half mile but it is believed the suspect got into a vehicle and drove away. The break in is still under investigation.

Patrol Division responded to a subject with a gun at Ross Park. The officer met with the complainant who advised that she was just down in the lower east parking lot of Ross Park when she saw a white Jeep Cherokee parked at the west end of the lot parked at an angle facing Mona Lake. The complainant said she saw the passenger in the vehicle pointing what she believed to be a handgun at the windshield from inside the vehicle. A felony stop was conducted and the subjects in the vehicle were taken into custody without any trouble. The weapon was seized and the gun was found to be a BB gun. No one was hurt or injured. Narcotics were found on the male subject and he was charged with possession of narcotics.


Patrol Division responded to over 25 retail fraud complaints that occurred at multiple stores throughout Norton Shores. Out of these complaints, approximately 20 suspects

are being charged with the crime. This is still one of the most reported crimes that officers respond to.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of March was 27,030 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

During the month of March 2016, the Department recorded 1851 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 876 calls for service. A total of 660 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Thursday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 9 parking tickets and 268 traffic citations in March, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 69% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

During the month of March, eleven officers, including six command officers, attended training. This included updates on laws, training on how to protect yourself, traffic enforcement, staying safe and ethics.

March 8, 2016: Two officers attended the Below 100 training which focused on officer safety when driving, dealing with suspects, training and maintaining your equipment.

March 16, 2016: Four officers attended Legal Update which is training for officers on new laws that have been passed. These new and updated laws include both criminal and civil. Legal Update is mandatory training for our officers.

March 18, 2016: Eight officers attended an Ethics Training class held at Grand Valley State University. This course went over ethics for police officers, internal investigations and training for the officers, which are elements to a healthy and corrupt free organization.

March 22, 2016: Three officers attended the Michigan Traffic Safety Summit. This three day seminar concentrated on seat belt enforcement strategies, construction hazards, marijuana-impaired drivers and emphasis on high risk drivers.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of March the Detective Bureau was assigned 13 new cases. Seven cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated embezzlement where an employee working for a property management group was taking the rent money from renters. The suspect confessed to the crime and is awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated two armed robberies in Norton Shores that were linked to 5 other robberies in the Greater Muskegon Area. A task force including Detectives and Officers from Norton Shores, Muskegon County Sheriff, City of Muskegon, City of Roosevelt Park, Fruitport Township, Michigan State Police, and Michigan State Parole teamed up and worked the cases. The suspect was apprehended by City of Muskegon after he robbed a gas station in downtown Muskegon. The subject is currently lodged on multiple charges and scheduled for court in April.

The Detective Bureau investigated an uttering and publishing case where a subject stole a checkbook from the victim's home and wrote \$10,000 worth of checks to themselves and cashed them at a local credit union. A search warrant was obtained to collect the financial records. The suspect was interviewed; they admitted to the crime and are currently lodged at Muskegon County Jail on multiple charges.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 42 arrest warrants and two search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a parole search of a subject and located 11 grams of cocaine packaged for sale on their person. A consent/parole search of their

home led to the discovery of an additional 23 grams of cocaine, and several prescription medications.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant where 100 grams of crack cocaine was located and approximately \$5,000.00 in cash. The owner of the residences was lodged.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a total of three search warrants in the month of March.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC assisted in executing a search warrant in Whitehall Michigan after receiving a tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) that was originally reported by Google. Google reported a user had uploaded child sexually abusive material (CSAM). The suspect was interviewed and confessed to searching for and saving CSAM. Several electronic devices were seized under the search warrant and evidence was located during the examinations of the devices'. A six count felony warrant was issued (three counts of possession of CSAM and three counts of using a computer to commit a crime).

The Detective from ICAC assisted in a knock and talk in the Grand Rapids area after receiving a NCMEC tip. The suspect admitted to viewing CSAM on their computer. A search warrant was obtained for the suspect's house. Several electronic devices were seized and CSAM was located on the devices. The suspect was arrested on a four count felony warrant.

SPECIAL SERVICES

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

March 1 and 8, 2016: Lt. Poel instructed a Below 100 class to area police officers. This class is aimed at reducing officer deaths nationwide to below 100.

March 9, 2016: Lt. Poel attended the department Command staff meeting at NSPD.

March 14, 2016: Lt. Poel met with local dignitaries to discuss current issues with LARA director Mike Zimmer at the Prosecutor's Office.

March 15, 2016: Lt. Poel attended the monthly Silent Observer board meeting.

March 16, 2016: Lt. Poel and Sgt. VanderStelt toured the ICAC facility and met with the D/Sgt. in charge of the unit.

March 24, 2016: Lt. Poel and the Special Services staff attended the Department Awards Ceremony.

March 29, 2016: Lt. Poel, Chief Gale, and Lt. Kasher met with our Guardian representative at NSPD to go over current issues and changes with the system.

March 30-31, 2016: Lt. Poel and Chief Gale attended the CALEA conference where we were awarded reaccreditation for another 4 years.
