**ADMINISTRATION**

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of April 2016.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

April 4, 2016: Chief Gale met with the Bike Time event coordinator for the 2016 planning.

April 5, 2016: Chief Gale met with Mlive reference press releases and communication issues.

April 15 & 16, 2016: Chief Gale taught classes for the Norton Shores Hunters Safety program.

Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 10% for the month and up by 7% for the fiscal year compared to last year. Class B type crimes were up by 7% for the month, and down by 3% for the fiscal year total. Total crimes were down by 4% for the month and up by 3% for the fiscal year to date.

**PATROL**

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Patrol Division responded to 24 retail fraud complaints. These complaints occurred at different stores throughout the city. Of those 24 complaints, 16 were closed by suspects being arrested and charged with the crime. In the last three months the road patrol has responded to and investigated over 100 retail fraud complaints. The officers have made arrests over 65% of the time.

Patrol Division responded to 24 business alarms that occurred throughout the city. All the alarms were checked and found to be false. The buildings were checked by the officers and the owner or managers were notified.

Patrol Division responded to over 50 accidents in April. These included hit and run and private property accidents. There were various reasons for accidents, some weather related and others were due to speed or failing to abide by the stop sign and traffic lights.

Patrol Division responded to a rash of car larcenies that took place in Norton Estates Trailer Park. Over eight cars were entered in a two night period. Items such as loose


change, iPod, electronic devices and clothing were things that were stolen. All of the cars were left unlocked and were parked. It was estimated that the crimes were committed between 1:00 am and 5:00 am. based on the investigation. The officers have developed two suspects and are still investigating the complaints.

Patrol Division responded to a complaint of a suspect spray painting buildings and signs along Henry Street. Officers arrived and located eight different buildings where the suspect maliciously spray painted the buildings and their signs, costing thousands of dollars in damage. The officers were able to locate the suspect at a nearby restaurant and found evidence that he had spray painted the buildings. The suspect was from out of town and there was no motive or reason for causing the damage. The suspect was arrested and lodged on multiple felony charges of malicious destruction of property.

Patrol Division responded to an alarm that was activated at local gun store. Officers responded and found that that building had been broken into. The officers found the window had been taken out and the suspect(s) entered through the opening. The building was searched and found that no one was inside. The crime scene was processed, which included photographing the scene, printing for finger prints and collecting evidence. It was reported that five guns were stolen. The make, model and caliber were all entered in to the LEIN system. The case is still being investigated.


Total cruiser mileage for the month of April was 25,671 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of April 2016, the Department recorded 1683 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 932 calls for service. A total of 657 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Friday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 9 parking tickets and 256 traffic citations in April, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 76% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

The patrol and command officers were scheduled for more than sixty hours of training this past month.

Five officers and two command officers went through eight hours of Defensive/Emergency Driving training. This course is set up to help assist the officers on their daily use of the cruiser. This also helps sharpen their skills when it comes to high speed and stressful driving under emergency situations.

Two officers were sent to Data Master training. This gives the officers updated training on how to use equipment for intoxicated drivers, and This helps officers accurately administer the test and present it in court as proof of evidence.

One officer attended training in Lansing for a class on Social Media Investigations. This training included how to track and investigate social media sites which include Twitter, Facebook, YouTube, Ask.fm, Snapchat, Foursquare and Tumblr. This 16 hour class trained officers on case studies, online undercover operations and what investigators need to know about emerging technologies.

Two officers and one command officer attended Legal Update which was held at Kalamazoo Community College. The officers learned about recently passed laws and were updated on existing laws that have changed.

**INVESTIGATIONS**

During the month of April the Detective Bureau was assigned 13 new cases. Nine cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a larceny where a service agent from a local credit union stole over \$10,000.00 from an elderly citizen's savings account. The offender was arrested and is currently lodged in the Muskegon County Jail awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated an embezzlement from a local business where the service manager was caught taking money out of the petty cash drawer after work hours. The actions were caught on surveillance video, and the offender confessed to the crime.

The Detective Bureau investigated an embezzlement from a local school where the payroll/secretary embezzled over \$200,000.00. The offender was arrested, confessed to the crime and is currently awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated two breaking and entering events at Shoreline Shooters. During the first event the subjects did not gain entry into the building. Two subjects were caught shortly after the security alarm went off. The two subjects confessed to the attempted break in and also gave the name of a third subject involved. That subject was interviewed and also admitted to being involved. The third subject's fingerprints were located inside the building and they are being charged for the second breaking and entering.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 52 arrest warrants and five search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a heroin overdose investigation in the area of Broadway and Getty where the driver of a vehicle was found slumped over in the driver's seat. A quantity of heroin was located inside the vehicle. After the patient received treatment, he admitted to the possession of the heroin and a warrant was issued for possession of heroin.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant where 4 grams of cocaine was located. The owner of the residence was lodged.

The Detective from WEMET participated in entry refresher training with other members of the WEMET task force this month.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC attended two weeks of training in Atlanta, Georgia, during the month of April.

The Detective from ICAC assisted the City of Muskegon Police Department and the Violent Crimes Task Force in analyzing several electronic devices related to the recent homicide investigations within Muskegon County.

**SPECIAL SERVICES**

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

April 13-16, 2016: Lt. Poel organized and instructed the spring Hunter Safety Course. Sixteen instructors consisting of City employees, former employees, and community members assisted with the instruction of the course. The weather was perfect for the outdoor instruction and over 30 students passed the course.

April 16, 2016: Lt. Poel played in the annual Guns and Hoses Charity Hockey Game. Over \$17,000 was raised for charity in this one day event. P.O.I.N.T. officers also attended the game to interact with the youth in attendance.

April 18, 2016: Lt. Poel attended the heroin task force meeting at the Prosecutor's Office.

April 19, 2016: Lt. Poel attended the WEMET Board meeting at the Ottawa County Sheriff's Office.

April 21, 2016: Lt. Poel coordinated the monthly user group training for all county Police agencies. MSP staff members from Lansing conducted the training in regards to reporting crime statistics to the FBI.

April 28, 2016: Lt. Poel and Ofc. Petrucha attended the first annual Law Enforcement Career Fair at Mona Shores High School. Several students attended the fair to learn how to become a police officer.
