Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 19% for the month and up by 5% for the fiscal year compared to last year. Class B type crimes were down by 40% for the month, and down by 6% for the fiscal year total. Total crimes were down by 28% for the month and down by 0.1% for the fiscal year to date. The decrease in class B crimes was due to a reporting error made that has been fixed and now matches the State of Michigan reporting system.

PATROL

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Patrol Division responded to 30 alarms throughout the city at business locations. All of the alarms were accidentally tripped and considered false alarms.

Patrol Division responded to a hold up alarm at a bank where it was reported that the bank was robbed by a suspect that stated he had a gun. The officers arrived and set up a perimeter. A K-9 unit responded to track the suspect that had fled on foot. The K-9 unit lost the scent of the track about a quarter of a mile from the bank. The crime scene was processed by detectives. The detectives also interviewed witnesses, and obtained video. The bank robbery is still being investigated.


Patrol Division responded to over fifteen car break-ins that occurred on the south east side. Two suspects had entered unlocked vehicles and stolen money, electronics and

prescription medications. This occurred over a period of three consecutive nights between the times of midnight and 4:00 am. The officers located one suspect in the neighborhood and chased him on foot. The suspect was caught and admitted to all the car break-ins. A second suspect was later identified and a warrant was obtained for his arrest. Most of the stolen items were returned to the victims.

Patrol Division responded to over 25 retail fraud complaints all over the city where suspect(s) are coming in and stealing items that are for sale. These suspects are sometimes reselling the items on the street or trading the stolen items for narcotics. The suspects that were caught have been arrested or charged with the crime of retail fraud or organized retail fraud. Retail fraud complaints still remain as one of the highest complaints that the officers respond too. These types of crimes happen all over the city at different retail business stores.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of May was 29,224 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of May 2016, the Department recorded 1674 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1171 calls for service. A total of 728 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Sunday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 6 parking tickets and 248 traffic citations in May, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 76% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

May 2-3, 2016: Four command officers attended an ethics training class held at Holland Police Department. This course discussed ethics for police officers, internal investigations and training for the supervisors, which are elements to a healthy and corrupt free organization.

May 4, 2016: Four officers and two command officers attended Legal Update which is training for officers on new laws that have been passed. These new and updated laws include both criminal and civil. Legal Update is mandatory training for our officers.

May 17-18, 2016: Two officers attended training at the Michigan Biometrics Conference which was in Grand Rapids. This conference covered Automated Facial Recognition, Live Scan using Audio/Video Analysis, Polygraph and Rapid DNA. This conference addressed a wide array of information pertaining to current issues, utilizing new equipment and updating the officers in the changes of the laws.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of May the Detective Bureau was assigned ten new cases. Seven cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated an armed robbery at the JP Mart on Getty St. and Broadway Ave. The road patrol located the subject within an hour of the robbery. The suspect was taken into custody. A search warrant was issued for the subject's vehicle and residence. Evidence of the crime was located at the home. The subject is currently in jail awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau is currently investigating an armed robbery at First Merit Bank. The subject implied a weapon, and took an undisclosed amount of cash, ran to the west of the bank and left the area in a vehicle. The Detectives are currently following leads in this case attempting to locate the suspect.

May 4, 2016: Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended the Muskegon County Suicide Death Review Team meeting.

May 6, 2016: Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended Place of Worship Security Training in Traverse City.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 29 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a traffic stop where a revolver was located in the center console and a locked safe on the front passenger floor. Search warrants were obtained for the driver's vehicle and residence. The safe contained approximately 20 grams of crystal meth along with other drug paraphernalia and over 100 prescription pills. The search of the residence uncovered an active meth lab and twenty-nine firearms. The offender is in custody and awaiting federal prosecution.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 3100 block of Fairfield. A subject was arrested after a packet of heroin and a stolen firearm were located inside the residence.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in six search warrants and seized 2.5 grams of crack cocaine, 21 grams of crystal meth and 31 firearms.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC assisted with the execution of two search warrants and assisted in examining over a dozen seized items from the residence.

The Detective from ICAC attended Michigan State Police Raid Entry School.
