**ADMINISTRATION**

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of August 2016.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

On August 2, Chief Gale attended the National Night out events at both the Target store and the Norton Estates neighborhood.

On August 3, Chief Gale attended the Bouncing with the Blues community event at Kangaroo Palace.

On August 4, Chief Gale assisted with a fund raiser for the Sportsmen for Youth program.

On August 7, Chief Gale attended the Muskegon Motorcycle club motorcycle hill climb provide incident command duties.

On August 10, Chief Gale attended the C.O.P.S board meeting which is all the area police chiefs and leaders meeting to discuss local issues in Law Enforcement.

On August 10, Chief Gale cooked for the city of Norton Shores employee appreciation luncheon.

On August 18 and 25, Chief Gale conducted second interviews for a new police officer position.

On August 26, Chief Gale cooked for a Police department and school administration annual lunch meeting.

Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 12% for the month and down by 9 % for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 34% for the month and 23% for the fiscal year. Total crimes were down by 22% for the month and 16% for the fiscal year.

**PATROL**

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Road Patrol Division responded to a suicidal subject in the 900 block of E Mt. Garfield. The officers arrived and were told by family member that their son had a knife and was threatening to hurt himself along with any officer that tries to make contact with him. The officers checked the area and located the male subject with a knife walking on Mt.

Garfield Rd. The officers noticed that the subject had a knife duct taped to his hand. The officers gave loud verbal commands to the subject to drop the knife and surrender himself. The male subject threatened officers and told officers to shoot him or he would come after them with the knife. The male subject refused to listen to the officer's commands so the officers were forced to use less than lethal force by tasing the subject. The subject was disarmed by the officers and was arrested for felonious assault. Ultimately, the subject was not harmed and neither were the officers. The subject was charged and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

The road patrol division responded to shots fired in the 1400 block of East Sherman. When the officers arrived they found a victim that had been shot multiple times and the suspects had fled on foot. The officers set up a perimeter and a K-9 unit was brought in to track the suspects. The officers processed the crime scene and worked with the Michigan State Crime Lab with collecting evidence. The shooting was determined to be a homicide. It has been turned over to the detective division and they are still currently investigating the case.


The road patrol division responded to 28 Retail Fraud complaints. These complaints occurred at different stores around the city. Out of those 28 complaints officers responded to 22 were closed by suspects being arrested and charged with the crime.

Officers responded to 35 business alarms that occurred throughout the city. All the alarms were checked and found to be false. The buildings were checked by the officers and the owner or managers were notified. Business alarms are one of the most frequent calls that our officers respond to. On average our officers respond to just over one active alarm a day.

Officers responded to a rash of car larcenies that took place in in different parts of the city. Over eight cars were entered in a three night period. This occurred on Furhman, Griesbach, Lawnel, Lincoln Park and Grand Haven Rd. Items such as loose change, iPods, electronic devices, prescription medication and wallets were stolen. All of the cars were left unlocked and were parked. It was estimated that the crimes were committed between midnight and 5:00 am. based on the investigation. The officers are still investigating.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of August was 27,178 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of August 2016, the Department recorded 80 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1326 calls for service. A total of 796 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Tuesday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 22 parking tickets and 186 traffic citations in August, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 63% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Eight officers including three command officers were sent to training this month. They were given over 190 hours of training this month.

Two officers were sent to 16 hours of training on how to be an instructor in active shooter and the schools.

Three officers were sent to a 40 hour class to become a field training officer. These officers are now certified in training new hired officers in how to be a police officer, train them on our policies and the procedures.

One command officer was sent to a 40 hour supervisor school that is part of his yearlong education that meets each month.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of August the Detective Bureau was assigned five new cases. Three cases were cleared by arrest, warrant or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau is actively investigating the homicide of a 23 year old male who was found deceased at his residence in the 1400 block of E. Sherman Blvd. Members of the violent crimes unit, WEMET, and ICAC have all been assisting the investigation.

The Detective Bureau concluded their investigation of the armed robbery at First Merit Bank on Norton Ave. The suspect was identified and is being charged with armed robbery. The suspect is currently lodged on multiple bank robbery charges from three banks across the State of Michigan.

The Detective Bureau investigated a stalking complaint in the 4600 block of Lauren Dr. A suspect was identified after posting lude sexual messages about a female on their YouTube channel. A search warrant was executed and evidence was collected related to the crime. An arrest warrant for stalking was granted and the offender was arrested. A trial on this case is pending.

The Detective Bureau investigated a suspicious fire in the 700 block of W. Hile Rd. Fire investigators determined the cause of the fire was from materials used to make butane hemp oil (BHO). Warrant has been requested for manufacturing of BHO.

The Detective Bureau investigated a child abuse case where a 19 month old child was treated at the ER for morphine/cocaine intoxication. The investigation determined a family member was doing cocaine at the house and left morphine pills out. The child woke up and ingested the morphine pills and cocaine. The child was treated with Narcan and transferred to Devos Children Hospital. The child has no permanent medical issues from the ingestion of the narcotics and was released from the hospital a few days after the incident. A felony 2<sup>nd</sup> degree child abuse warrant was issued against the family member and they turned themselves in.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 51 arrest warrants and 13 search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted in the indictment of two male subjects from Muskegon County in federal court on three charges of delivery of narcotics. When taken into custody 14.5 grams of crystal meth and about \$3,000.00 in cash were seized.

The Detective from WEMET was pulled from his assignment at WEMET to assist with the homicide investigation that accrued on August 15<sup>th</sup> and has been working with detectives on the homicide case.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC completed seven cellular phone extractions related to the homicide investigation.

The Detective from ICAC investigated a criminal sexual conduct case that occurred at Ross Park. The offender confessed to the act and a CSC 4 degree charge is being issued.
