ADMINISTRATION

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of July 2016.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

July 7, 2016: Chief Gale met with the Muskegon County Clerk to discuss new election security measures.

July 13, 2016: Chief Gale attended the Muskegon County C.O.P.S. Board meeting where topics of interest in Muskegon County were discussed with area chiefs and law enforcement leaders.

July 13, 2016: Chief Gale attended the Ice Cream with the Police event at the Frosty Oasis. The event was a big hit and was well attended.

July 14-16, 2016: Chief Gale assisted with Incident Command at Bike Time. Bike Time was well attended, did not cause any safety concerns and traffic flow was near normal.

July 21, 2016: Chief Gale met with car camera and body camera vendors to look at options for the Capital Improvement camera upgrades for FY2017.

PATROL

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Patrol Division responded to Ross Park Elementary School on a breaking and entering report. Officers found that the school had been entered by breaking a window sometime overnight. Items taken were some tools along with petty cash. Officers processed the scene which included photographing it, checking for fingerprints and reviewing video footage. A suspect was developed and was later apprehended. The suspect admitted to breaking into the school and he was charged with the crime.

The Patrol Division responded to the 2700 block of Forest Hills Road on a breaking and entering report in progress. The officers located a suspect who had entered the garages of two homes and had stolen some items. This had occurred in the early morning hours. Officers pursued the suspect on foot and apprehended him. The suspect admitted to breaking into the garage and the stolen items were recovered. The suspect was then charged and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

The Patrol Division responded to over 50 alarms at different businesses and residential homes throughout the city. All of these alarms were found to be false. The buildings and homes were checked and found to be secure.

The Patrol Division responded to four different complaints of counterfeit money being passed. The suspect(s) entered a store to purchase items, then pay for the items with a fake \$100 bill at which time the suspect(s) would receive the change back and leave the store. At other businesses the suspect(s) would exchange the \$100 bill for change and

then leave. The fake \$100 bills were passed at different locations throughout the City of Norton Shores and throughout the County of Muskegon. The officers developed two suspects. The officers are working with detectives from other agencies in Muskegon County and the investigation is still continuing.


The Patrol Division responded to a breaking and entering report at Mona Shores High School. It was found that multiple laptop computers and other electronic items had been stolen. Officers processed the scene and examined the security video. From the video a suspect was developed and later apprehended. The suspect confessed to the crime and he was charged and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

The Patrol Division responded to the 1000 block of Bellway on multiple car break ins. Approximately five cars had been broken into and such things as change, sunglasses and miscellaneous items were stolen. The break ins occurred sometime during the overnight hours. The officers are continuing to investigate the case to develop a suspect.

The Patrol Division responded to 1281 Pontaluna on a home invasion report where the home owner had been assaulted during a robbery. The officer investigated the crime and developed two suspects. The motive behind the break in was the victim owed money to the suspect. The officers were able to locate the suspects and after interviewing them the suspects confessed to the crime. Both suspects were arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail on breaking and entering and assault.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of July was 27,311 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of July 2016, the Department recorded 1631 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1340 calls for service. A total of 890 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Friday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 28 parking tickets and 162 traffic citations in July, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 66.1% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Officer training this month included Firearms Training; Officers to Assist the Community; and a command officer being sent to a supervisor school.

Two officers were sent to training regarding assisting with school programs, neighborhood associations and ideas on what new concepts are being taught. It gave our officers suggestions on how to manage civil conflicts, public speaking and putting on programs for the community.

One command officer was sent to a week-long First Line Supervision School. The command officer was a newly promoted command officer and the department sent him for 24 hour training on how to manage people, documentation, the importance of communication and how to prioritize the daily job.

Multiple officers were trained on firearms this past month. The officers were at the range where they practiced being proficient on their duty assigned weapons.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of July the Detective Bureau was assigned fourteen new cases. Six cases were cleared by arrest, warrant or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a robbery/home invasion in Pontaluna Shores Trailer Park. A male drug dealer entered the female victim's home uninvited, assaulted her and took money, credit cards, and a cell phone and fled. The offender's girlfriend was present at the time and assisted in the robbery. The offenders were identified by the victim, arrest warrants were signed and both were arrested on the charges. An additional arrest warrant for another subject has been filed for lying during a felony investigation.

The Detective Bureau is investigating a large amount of counterfeit bill complaints. There have been several bills passed in Norton Shores and even more throughout Muskegon County. Our Detectives are working with other Detectives in the county to locate the offenders. The Secret Service is assisting in the investigation.

The Detective Bureau attended training on illegal gambling.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 38 arrest warrants and five search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET is investigating a heroin overdose death. Family members were able to identify the heroin dealer and charges are being pressed for delivery of heroin causing death.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in mass scenario training near the Mart Dock for the Michigan State Police and the FBI emergency response teams.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC analyzed several devices for the City of Grand Rapids in a large fraud investigation.

The Detective from ICAC assisted his team in four search warrants in July. Three were conducted in Kent County and one in Muskegon County. All of the warrants produced Child Sexual Abusive Material (CSAM). Charges have been pressed on all offenders involved.

SPECIAL SERVICES

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Lt. Poel met with High School staff in regards to programs and security of the school for the upcoming year.

Lt. Poel organized the interviews for the soon to be vacant WEMET position. A new member of the department was selected to be assigned to WEMET starting in September.

Lt. Poel organized the application process for a new police officer to replace Ofc. Speet who retired this month.

Ofc. Trombley has been assigned to light duty and Ofc. Sinclair was assigned back to the road patrol to fill Ofc. Speet's vacant position.
