CITY COUNCIL MEETING

A rescheduled meeting of the Norton Shores City Council was held Monday, November 2, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. in the Community Room, Norton Shores Branch Library, 705 Seminole Road. The invocation was delivered by Pastor Doug VanderMolen.

15-149 Minutes

Council Member Dolack moved to adopt the minutes of the October 20, 2015 City Council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Flanders and carried unanimously.

Council Member Jurkas moved to adopt the minutes of the October 27, 2015 City Council work session. The motion was supported by Council Member Ostrom and carried unanimously.

15-150 Consent Agenda

Council Member Beecham moved to adopt the Consent Agenda which consisted of a bid authorization for water meters. The motion was supported by Council Member Martines and carried unanimously.

15-151 Bid Award – Police Equipment Lockers

Council Member Dolack moved to adopt a resolution awarding the bid for 22 police equipment lockers to the low bidder, AME Vertical of Troy, Michigan in the amount of \$16,160.50. The motion was supported by Council Member Martines and carried unanimously.

15-152 CDBG Citizen Participation Plan

Council Member Martines moved to adopt a resolution approving the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Citizen Participation Plan. The motion was supported by Council Member Moulatsiotis and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Kay Deuster of 1504 Airport Road encouraged the City Council to expand Norton Cemetery, a subject that was discussed at the October 27, 2015 work session. She said the City could reduce deposits into the perpetual care fund to eliminate the necessity for General Fund subsidy. Mayor Nelund explained that there is no available adjacent property.
