Enjoy this time with family and friends. It truly is a wonderful time of the year.



## Fiscal Year 2017 Budget

In May the City Council approved the Fiscal Year 2017 Budget. Below is a breakdown by individual Fund:

The overall millage rate remains at 10.95 mills.

## Election Update

The City Clerk's Office is preparing for what could be a record-setting year for voter turnout. We would like to remind you that if you are 60 years of age or older you can avoid waiting in line at the polls by voting via absentee ballot. The deadlines for registering to vote or changing your address are Tuesday, July 5th for the August Primary Election and Tuesday, October 11th for the November General Election.

## Disposal of Leaves and Yard Waste

In November of 2013, City Council adopted an Ordinance requiring property owners to remove fallen leaves outside of the leaf season on property with a principal structure. LEAF SEASON is defined as beginning September 1 and ending April 30. Enforcement of this Ordinance began May 1.

Effective June 1st, the leaf site on Wood Road will be open Saturdays and Sundays from 11 a.m. until 7 p.m. throughout the summer.

## Continuing Improvements to Black Lake Park

Black Lake Park is a 58 acre parcel, located near the southern boundary of Norton Shores, between Wood Road and the eastern shoreline of Little Black Lake. The park provides passive recreation opportunities for nature lovers with a number of bird, animal, and plant species to observe. In 2015, the City was awarded a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund (MNRTF) grant to acquire 13 additional acres representing 1,100 feet of Little Black Lake shoreline. Recent installments to the northern loop include raised boardwalks in addition to the observation deck, and the southern loop is ADA compliant including the observation deck. There is also a picnic area with several picnic tables, a grill for cooking, and ADA compliant restrooms. Future plans for the park include additional nature trails and a possible launch facility for kayaks and canoes.


